

MANITOBA PRACTICE ASSESSMENT PROGRAM (MPAP)

Full registration in Manitoba is granted to physicians who hold either (a) the LMCC and certification by the College of Family Physicians of Canada or (b) certification by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. Physicians who do not meet the criteria for full registration may be granted conditional registration for a limited period of time in order to permit them to meet the requirements for full registration in Manitoba. Amendments have been made to Regulation 25/03 to provide an alternate route to achieve full registration, namely successful completion of an approved summative assessment, the Manitoba Practice Assessment Program. The summative assessment process is conducted by the University of Manitoba, Faculty of Medicine, Division of Continuing Professional Development. Only physicians who are currently practising in Manitoba may apply for MPAP. Conditional registrants who are actively participating in the MPAP process may be granted temporary registration in order to permit them to complete the assessment process.
