

REQUIREMENTS FOR REGULATED MEMBER, PROVISIONAL REGISTRATION Family Practice Limited [CPSM General Regulation, s. 3.19]

The family practice limited class is intended to permit the registration of physicians who do not meet the educational or postgraduate training requirements for full registration but meet certain specified minimum standards and commit to work towards achieving the requirements for full registration within a specified time (5 years).

Applicants must meet the academic requirement for registration (i.e. a medical degree from a nationally approved faculty) and are given 5 years in which to obtain the LMCC and certification from the College of Family Physicians or a designation of successful or partially successful in the Manitoba Practice Assessment Program. As a result, additional requirements for initial registration are imposed in certain circumstances. Each requirement is followed immediately by particulars of the exemptions for that specific requirement:

CREDENTIALS:

1. Hold a medical degree from a nationally approved faculty of medicine or a Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine degree from a school in the U.S. accredited by the American Osteopathic Association Commission on Osteopathic College accreditation.
2. Establish that he or she meets one of the following requirements:
 - a. holds CFPC certification, or confirmation by the CFPC as eligible for certification;
 - b. holds certification in family medicine from the Collège des Médecins du Québec;
 - c. holds certification from a Member Board in family medicine or is confirmed by a Member Board to be eligible;
 - d. completed two years of postgraduate clinical training in family medicine that:
 - A. is approved by the Registrar;
 - B. took place in one or more health care facilities recognized by a national postgraduate training authority; and
 - C. is accredited with a national postgraduate training authority or was accredited at the time the training was completed.
 - e. Has completed at least one year of post graduate training that meets the requirements of subparagraphs (d)(A) to (C), and he or she has had a total of at least three years practice experience in family medicine in the preceding five year period;
3. Hold an unexpired pass standing in:
 - a. the Medical Council of Canada Evaluating Examination; or
 - b. Part I or Part II, or both, of the Medical Council of Canada Qualifying Examination **unless they are exempt from the examination requirement because they:**
 - A. possess a degree in medicine from a medical school recognized by the Committee on Accreditation of Canadian Medical Schools or the Liaison Committee on Medical Education of the American Medical Association and the Associate of American Medical Colleges;
 - B. hold CFPC certification, or is confirmed by the CFPC as eligible for certification or has completed a Canadian family medicine residency training program;
 - C. are applying for the Practice Ready Assessment (PRA) (*effective 10 March 2023*);
 - D. hold certification in family medicine obtained from the Collège des Médecins du Québec; or
 - E. hold Member Board certification in family medicine and has satisfactorily completed a postgraduate training program in family medicine accredited by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (USA).

4. Have completed a family practice assessment approved by Council and entered into a satisfactory arrangement with a practice mentor, unless he or she is exempt from the assessment and mentorship requirements because
 - a. he or she establishes, to the satisfaction of the Registrar, that he or she:
 - A. was previously registered in good standing and practised in Manitoba but has subsequently ceased to hold registration;
 - B. has either completed an approved family practice assessment approved by the Registrar while he or she was registered in Manitoba; and
 - C. has the training and experience necessary to competently engage in family practice area.
 - b. holds CFPC certification or provides written confirmation from the CFPC that he or she is eligible for certification by the CFPC;
 - c. holds certification in family medicine by the Collège des Médecins du Québec; or.
 - d. holds Member Board certification in family medicine and has satisfactorily completed a postgraduate training program accredited by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (USA).

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS:

1. Establish that he or she has engaged in the area of family practice that he or she intends to undertake in Manitoba within the approved time period.
2. If applicable, provide a description of the continuing professional development activities that the applicant was required to complete as a condition of authorization to practice family medicine in Canada in the three years immediately preceding the application and how the applicant met these requirements.
3. Hold a certificate from the Minister of Health stating that the physician is required to provide medical services in a specified geographical area or practice setting.
4. Have entered into an arrangement satisfactory to the College with a practice supervisor.
