REQUIREMENTS FOR REGULATED MEMBER PROVISIONAL REGISTRATION – TEMPORARY-LOCUM [CPSM General Regulation, s. 3.30]

If a physician intending to do a locum in Manitoba otherwise meets the requirements for <u>full registration</u>, he or she will be fully registered. However, in the following specified circumstances a physician may be registered in the temporary-locum class if he or she does not currently meet the requirements for full (practising) or provisional (specialty practice - limited or family practice - limited) registration:

CREDENTIALS:

- 1. He or she was previously registered
 - a. as a registrant in good standing on the Manitoba Medical Register under *The Medical Act*,
 - b. as a full (practising), provisional (specialty practice limited), or provisional (family practice limited) member in good standing but has ceased to practise in Manitoba.
- 2. He or she is currently authorized to practise medicine in Canada or elsewhere.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS:

The applicant must establish that he or she:

- a. is competent to engage in his or her professional practice for the purpose specified in his or her application;
- b. has entered into a satisfactory locum agreement with a regulated member who holds a current certificate of practice
- c. has received written approval from the CPSM to practise as a locum for a time period not to exceed 12 months, except where, in exceptional circumstances, the Registrar has extended the 12 month time period.

CONDITIONS

Conditions will be imposed related to the practise setting. Other conditions may be imposed, depending upon the circumstances.

TIME LIMITED AND LOCATION SPECIFIC REGISTRATION [s. 3.31]

All temporary – locum registrations are limited to a specified time and specified location.
