



Standard of Practice Self-Reporting to CPSM

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Standards of Practice of Medicine set out the requirements related to specific aspects for the quality of the practice of medicine. Standards of Practice of Medicine provide more detailed information than contained in the *Regulated Health Professions Act*, Regulations, and Bylaws. All members must comply with Standards of Practice of Medicine, per section 86 of the *Regulated Health Professions Act*.

This Standard of Practice of Medicine is made under the authority of section 82 of the *Regulated Health Professions Act* and section 15 of the CPSM Standards of Practice Regulation.

1. Members who have a diminished ability to provide safe, competent medical care have an ethical responsibility to appropriately restrict practice or withdraw from practice, and report to CPSM.
2. A member must report the following personal circumstances to CPSM at the time of registration or whenever the member becomes aware thereafter:
 - 2.1. a sexual or inappropriate personal relationship between the member and a patient;
 - 2.2. any voluntary or involuntary loss or restriction of diagnostic or treatment privileges granted by an administrative authority or any resignation in lieu of further administrative or disciplinary action.
